"Improving GBV victims support services and the access to justice through Trauma-informed Care - Care4Trauma"

The EU project "Improving GBV victims support services and the access to justice through Traumainformed Care - Care4Trauma" is financed by the EU Commission.

The project started on June 1, 2022 and will last until November 30, 2024, with total project worth of EUR 412,432.00.

Main goal of the project is to improve support services for women who have survived gender-based violence and their access to justice through Trauma-informed Care.

Main activities:

- Research on women who survived genderbased violence and reaction of country reports based on the collection and analysis of data on gender-based violence and the use of trauma-based help and support systems
- Advocacy activities aimed at raising awareness of the effectiveness of traumabased aid and support systems
- Education of social workers, social pedagogues, lawyers, psychologists and psychiatrists on the approach to traumabased care (TIC)
- Increasing the capacities of employees in shelters for women who have survived violence
- Creation of training programs and conduction of trainings intended for social workers, lawyers who provide support to women who have survived violence, and creation of a specialized program for psychotraumatology and a system of help and support based on trauma
- The Handbook is meant to provide a guide for the implementation of the TIC
- Communication activities aiming at Increasing the awareness and knowledge of stakeholders about the access to justice through Trauma-informed Care related to gender-based violence.

The target groups:

- Social workers, social pedagogues, lawyers, psychologists and psychiatrists
- Organizations which provide support to women survivors of gender-based violence, institutions that work or provide support to women survivors
- Representatives of state institutions and representatives of local self-government units

The project, among others aims to to educate target groups and improve thier knowledge and awareness of Trauma-informend Care, its applications and problems related to accessing justice for women who have survived gender-based violence.





Kick-off meeting


On July 1, 2022 the kick-off meeting among the partners of the EU project "Improving GBV victims support services and the access to justice through Trauma-informed Care - Care4Trauma" was held via Zoom application.
